Solar is on the rise across Florida

Depending on where you do business in Florida, it's likely that solar energy is already powering a part of that community. Over the last few years, we've installed solar technology across the state to provide businesses like schools, museums and zoos hands-on experience with renewable energy. In fact, we're building eight new solar energy centers by early 2018 comprised of more than 2.5 million solar panels, which is enough to wrap around Florida's coastline more than two times. 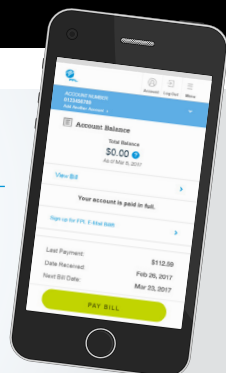
Our innovative approach to investing in clean energy, while keeping it reliable and affordable, continues to pay off. Since 2001, we've phased out older, less-efficient power plants and replaced them with cleaner, more efficient ones. This has prevented 108 million tons of carbon emissions and allowed us to save more than \$8.6 billion in fuel costs, which we were able to pass along to all of our customers.

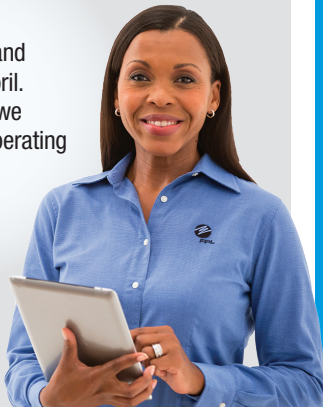
